Temperature Check Results

On Sunday June 23 at 3pm, members of Central gathered to take a temperature check of our congregation as a result of the changes made at General Conference in regards to human sexuality. Of the 202 ballots cast, the result were split: 55% wanted to Stay United Methodist and 45% wanted to leave the UMC.

This information from this temperature check will give guidance to our Administrative Council, Staff Parish and Trustee teams. Our next scheduled Administrative Council meeting is Tuesday, July 16 at 6 pm.

We believe there is more that binds us together than separates us; however, we also recognize each person has to follow their conscience. Some of you may consider leaving. Some of you may now choose to officially join Central. For many of you, Central is your church family to stay. Disassociation Process Update

The Board of Trustees for the Holston Annual Conference met on Wednesday, June 26th to continue their work on a process for churches seeking to exit the denomination who find it untenable to continue effective ministry as a United Methodist Church due to changes in language in the Book of Discipline regarding human sexuality. This work is being done to fulfill the promise provided in the Fall 2022 Resolution that the conference will seek a fair, gracious, and non-punitive process to permit a local church to sever its ties to The United Methodist Church, subject to these certain conditions, if one is not provided by the General Conference.

Since our last communication, at least 2 Annual Conferences have sought Declaratory Decisions from the United Methodist Judicial Council to find out if such a process is even permitted in accordance with the Book of Discipline and actions of General Conference eliminating a disaffiliation process.

Accordingly, the Board of Trustees are working diligently to develop a process utilizing provisions of the Book of Discipline to accomplish what was promised without violating the Book of Discipline. For this reason, the process being finalized has multiple steps and provisions that are designed to withstand scrutiny by the Judicial body of The United Methodist denomination.

Likewise, since the disaffiliation process has been terminated, the process Holston Conference will use, that permits a church to disassociate from the United Methodist denomination, will necessarily be through the process of church closure under the Book of Discipline ¶2549.

We anticipate the Judicial Council will issue a Decision later this year. In the meantime, the Board of Trustees will continue to move forward with the implementation of this process we have put together. However, for obvious reasons, no church closures will be finalized until the Judicial Council has ruled such a process is legally appropriate.

While there are a few additional steps to be finalized, we anticipate the work of the trustees to conclude in the next few weeks.

Will pastors be forced to officiate same-sex weddings?

No, UMC pastors have always decided whom they will marry. This is based on several factors including the couples' preparation for the marriage covenant. This has not changed. Pastors will continue to decide whom they will marry. There is no mechanism in Conference leadership nor desire on the part of the bishop to determine whom a pastor will marry.

As the newly adopted language reads, we will "not penalize any clergy for performing, or refraining from performing, a same-sex marriage service." The desires of all clergy are to be honored and not judged by others.

<u>Does our church now have to host same-sex weddings?</u>

No, the General Conference legislation explicitly protects the rights of clergy and churches not to officiate at or host same-sex weddings. The UMC will not "require any local church to hold or prohibit a local church from holding a same-sex marriage service on the property of the local church."

We know that different people have different opinions on these matters and our churches are in different contexts within the bounds of the Holston Conference. The bishop expects that the diversity of everyone's opinion and everyone's context will be honored.

CUMC has currently voted through the Trustee committee and affirmed by the church council to not hold same sex marriages based on the current ministers' recommendations and the desire of leadership to keep the same policies as were in place before General Conference.
